More than \$10.7 million in capital improvements

In 2010, Raleigh General Hospital completed our Outpatient Surgery and Endoscopy expansions in the Raleigh Medical Complex, which cost more than \$5 million. In addition, we expanded and enhanced our wireless technology and added another Echo machine as well as upgrades to our patient safety-focused AcuDose medication system.

In fact, we invested over \$10.7 million in our facilities last year which, in addition to the above, included technology replacement, information technology additions/updates, and important facility upkeep and maintenance.

Contributing to our local tax base

Last year, Raleigh General Hospital paid nearly \$6 million in property and sales taxes that have helped to support our city, county and state. These dollars help support local schools, the development of roads, the recruitment of business and industry and other vital community services.

Helping those In need

Raleigh General Hospital provided more than \$214.7 million in uncompensated care last year, which included the amounts not covered by Medicare and Medicaid. This amount includes \$22.2 million for charity care and bad debt, incurred as we served many people without the financial resources to pay for basic health services.

Adding to the medical staff

During the past year, Raleigh General Hospital has added 11 new physicians to our highly respected medical staff, including specialists in interventional cardiology, cardiology, neurology, pathology and internal medicine.

One of our community's major employers

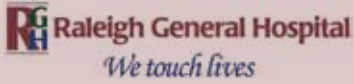
